Dear Dr. Copeland:-

I have developed a synthetic compound that cures tuberculosis in moderately advanced cases. The recovery takes from three to six weeks only one treatment of fifteen drops of a 2x solution being required and this is administered subcutaneously. I have not used it on moribund cases at all.

Would you be interested in its demonstration? I would gladly show you privately at first what it will do. In three or four weeks after the treatment is given you will be able to judge its value. Then if you are satisfied and willing we can have a demonstration to the profession which will teach what tuberculosis really is and how to cure it.

I am consulting you on this important step in search for the means to introduce the treatment without quackery and so as to avoid insult and hold-up on the part of the A.M.A. My identity could be withheld if desirable.
