

Resolution

TO THE SENATE JUDICIARY COMMITTEE REGARDING THE KOCH TREATMENT

Whereas the executive council of the Ministerial Federation of America, an organization of churchmen representing all evangelical denominations reaching into every one of the forty-eight states, is presently in session at Detroit, Michigan, and

Whereas said organization has informed itself regarding the scholastic and professional attainments of William Frederick Koch, Ph. D., M. D., together with the unselfish and humanitarian service he has rendered during more than thirty years of medical practice, and

Whereas reputable publications, chemists and physicians, medical congresses and the latest professional and scientific texts advocate uses of chemistry today, which Doctor Koch advocated twenty-five to thirty years ago, and

Whereas officials of such governments as Brazil, British Columbia, Belgium, the Belgian Congo, Great Britain and others have long recognized the value of Doctor Koch's work, and

Whereas independent investigations made by medical representatives of the Ministerial Federation of America disclose unprecedented therapeutic value in the use of the Koch Treatment, and

Whereas the clergymen of this Federation, in conjunction with a number of other organizations are interested in the health and welfare of their people and seek that justice be done, and

Whereas our Federation of Ministers has come into possession of evidence that Doctor Koch is being subjected to the vilest kind of persecution, torture and harassment by interests capable of influencing members of the Department of Justice at Washington, and

Whereas we are in possession of evidence showing that deceit, coercion, intimidation, smearing and physical violence, not to mention flagrant violations of legal procedure, are being used in an attempt to destroy Doctor Koch and keep his wonderful system of treatment for the relief of human suffering from the world, and

Whereas failing in two court cases to find Doctor Koch guilty of any wrongdoing, his persecutors have also resorted to methods of slow strangulation by securing an injunction restricting his practice to narrow bounds while the death toll from cancer is mounting each year and people are dying of tuberculosis, poliomyelitis, arthritis, leprosy and other diseases for want of his services, and

Whereas the professional services of more than one thousand practicing physicians in the United States are being jeopardized by this heartless abuse of injunction privileges, and

Whereas the only course open to a suffering public and a victim of persecution is the exercise of the constitutional right of petition to the duly elected representatives of the people, now therefore

Be It Resolved that the Judiciary Committee of the United States Senate be asked to take steps as may be necessary to lift said injunction and begin immediately an investigation of the Department of Justice in relation to this malicious travesty on justice.
